## BE SAFE TARANAKI TRADES APPRENTICESHIP CHALLENGE 2014

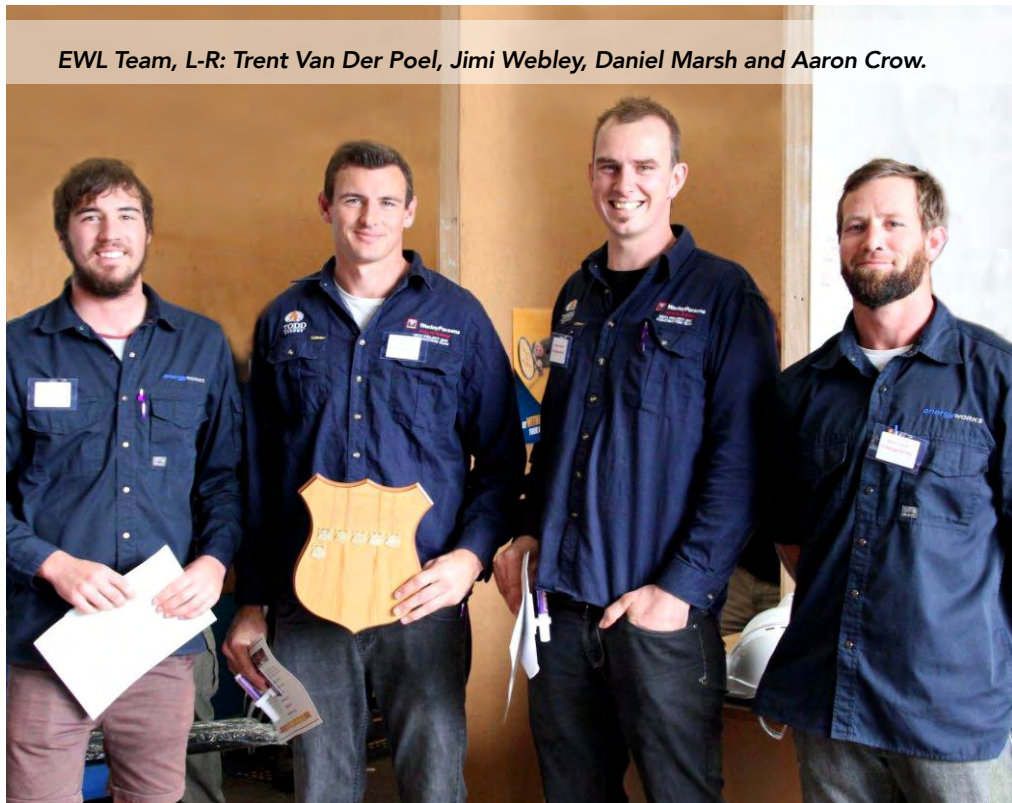

## GET BEHIND ROB KIRKWOOD AND SUPPORT THE NZ RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE

In November this year Energyworks HSE Advisor Rob Kirkwood is running the Auckland marathon as part of the Ronald McDonald House Auckland charity team.

Ronald McDonald House Auckland is a charitable trust that provides shelter and support (free of charge) to families from all over New Zealand whose children have been admitted to Starship Children's Hospital. Whilst the hospital focuses on the medical needs of the

child, Ronald McDonald House Auckland focuses on the emotional, practical and financial needs of the entire family. The house keeps the entire family together throughout their children's medical journey so that they are better placed to cope and help their children heal.

In June this year Rob's 6 year old Daughter spent 3 weeks in Starship Children's Hospital after undergoing open heart surgery related to a genetic condition called Marfans Syndrome.



Rob and his family have been visiting Starship on and off for the last 5 years and during these visits they have always stayed at Ronald McDonald House.

It is estimated that it costs \$120 a night to house a family at Ronald McDonald House so Rob has pledged to raise at least \$2500 for the house. The \$2500 will go towards the equivalent cost of housing Rob's family during their last visit.

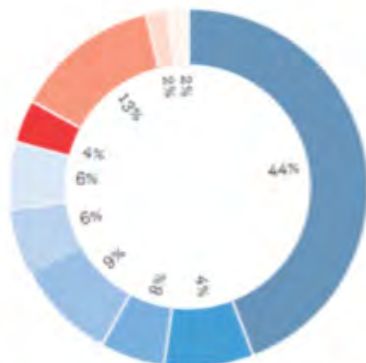

## RECENTLY COMPLETED PROJECTS

### Mangahewa C Development

The Mangahewa Wellsite Development provides wellsite facilities adjacent to the existing Mangahewa C Wellsite. The new facilities are for gas supply to the existing McKee-Mangahewa Production Station via new 150NB and 200NB pipelines. Construction commenced in November 2013 and completed in May this year with 37,500 injury free man hours. It was made up of modules for the purpose of future relocation, the five modules are;

- Valve Module
- Over Pressure Protection Module
- Cooler Module
- Metering Module
- Coalescor Module

## CURRENT PROJECTS

### Yashili Pipeline

The Yashili Pipeline Project in Pokeno has seen our guys construct 7.6 kilometres of 6" steel gas distribution pipeline for Vector. The pipeline runs from Bollard Road, Tuakau to the new Yashili Dairy Factory in Pokeno along a combination of roads and farmland. Construction has been primarily horizontal directional drilling with some open trenching. Energyworks scope will be complete by the end of August and once the new Factory is in operation it will create 120 local jobs, producing 52,000 tons of baby formula per year.

## UPCOMING PROJECTS

### Mangahewa D, E, F

EWL has recently been awarded the Process Module Fabrication package for Mangahewa E. Process Module Fabrication and Site Installation packages are expected to now follow for Mangahewa D & F. The process module package involves full workshop construction and testing of 5 separate modules for gaswell processing (Choke Module, Pig Launcher, Test Choke and Metering, Over Pressure Protection and Wellhead Sandcatchers).

### Jemena

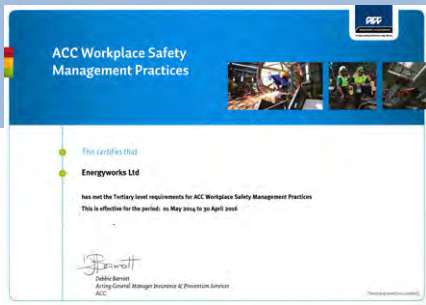
EWL has also been awarded a contract for construction of two Scraper Stations inland from Gladstone in Queensland, Australia. The Scraper Station structural supports and pipework will be constructed in our Bell Block facility, prior to export to Australia. The Scraper Stations are to be installed by EWL Group Australia at each end of a new 30 kilometre pipeline aimed at fulfilling increasing demands for gas supply in North Queensland.
